**Term:** Equiparance

**Quote:** ...an *equiparance*; that is, the relation of *B* to *A* is essentially the same as that of *A* to *B*, so far as the duality of the pair is concerned. But no equiparance whatever, with the exception of the very few that are necessary, such as *identity, coexistence, etc.*, is a *logically simple relation*.
