**Quote:** A sign is intended to correspond to a real thing, or fact, or to something relatively real; and this *object* of the sign may be the very sign itself, as when a map is precisely superposed upon that which it maps. It is a perfection of the sign if it separately represents its object; in which case it becomes a proposition and is true or false.
