**Term:** Corollarial Consequence

**Quote:** I draw a distinction between *Corollarial* consequences and *Theorematic* consequences. A corollarial consequence is one the truth of which will become evident simply upon attentive observation of a diagram constructed so as to represent the conditions stated in the conclusion.
