**Term:** Dyadosemeion

**Quote:** ...the division of signs according to their Monadic Objects is simply into 1<sup>st</sup>, Signs of Objects whose Being is Monadic (signs of qualities, etc), 2<sup>nd</sup>, Signs of Objects whose Being is Dyadic (signs of existents, past events, etc), 3<sup>rd</sup>, Signs of Objects whose Being is Triadic (Signs of Laws, Types, etc.). *Names: Monadosemeion, Dyadosemeion, Triadosemeion.*
