**Term:** Phaneron

**Quote:** By the *Phaneron* (a Proper noun) I mean the single entirety, or total, or whole, of that which the reader has in mind in any sense. This is vague, and is meant to be so; but the clause "in any sense" renders it less vague, since it thereby includes symbolic and habitual cognition.
