**Term:** Scroll

**Quote:** A pair of cuts, one within the other but not within any other cut that that other is not within, shall be called a scroll. The outer cut of the pair shall be called the *outloop*, the inner cut the *inloop*, of the scroll. The area of the inloop shall be termed the *inner close* of the scroll; the area of the outloop, *excluding the enclosure of the inloop* (and not merely its area), shall be termed the *outer close* of the scroll.
