**Term:** Rhema

**Quote:** A *Rheme* is a Sign which, for its Interpretant, is a Sign of qualitative Possibility, that is, is understood as representing such and such a kind of possible Object. Any rheme, perhaps, will afford some information; but it is not interpreted as doing so.  
[—] Or we may say that a Rheme is a sign which is understood to represent its Object in its characters merely...
